Bishop Stopford's Pupil Premium Review 2019/20

Schools are held accountable for the spending of these monies and performance tables will capture the achievement of disadvantaged students covered by the Pupil Premium. This document details the impact of grant spending for the academic year 2019-20.

Planned focus on intervention for 2020-21 is also included as a result of the impact review that has taken place for the academic year 2019-20.

The **Pupil Premium** provides funding for pupils:

- who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years (ever 6) (£935 per child)
- who are adopted from care under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 1 or who have left care on a special guardianship order or child arrangements order (£2,300 per child)
- for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces, or whose parent /guardian is in receipt of a pension from the MoD (£300 per child)

School Context and focus

- In 2019-20 there were 262 pupil premium students in the school. This represented 39.2% of the school cohort. This compares to a national figure of 27.1% for all mainstream secondary schools ⁽¹⁾. - 21.3% of the school cohort were entitled to and claiming free school meals. This compares to a national figure of 17.3% for all Secondary Schools.

In order to meet the needs of our students, we have developed the use of the funding alongside main school funding to reduce and diminish the trends in terms of differences in attainment for pupil premium students. Funding is targeted and focused to ensure that our disadvantaged students have increased opportunity to improve their academic outcomes and that their achievement is more in line with those of all students within the school. Based on research from the Education Endowment Report we have directed the funds towards the most effective interventions. We have strategically identified the needs of individual students (their preferences and barriers to learning) and used this to put a programme of support together for them.
