


Bishop Stopford's School Newsletter

The e-code is issued by Edenred and will have been sent to your e-mail address. Please note this code must be redeemed by Sunday 14th January 2024 (it cannot be reissued) but the supermarket voucher can be spent after this date. Bishop's Strive and Succeed at Enfield Cross Country Event

Our core Strive for Five values of consideration, respect, loyalty, responsibility and success were on show for all to see at the recent athletics event at Trent Country Park. Cross country running is a physically and mentally tough event and we were very proud to see the resilience of our students across all year groups competing at the highest level.

Lower school students ran 3,000m and upper school students a 3,500m distance through wild terrain and dense forests. With four major uphill climbs the race was challenging and extreme. All of students competed well in the strong field of competitors with outstanding performances from Year 7 Sheldon (7th), Year 8 Julia (16th), and Year 11 Yevhennia (8th). Students ranking in the Top 10 are considered exceptional performers.

Tottenham Hotspur 5-a-side Football

Our Year 9 and 10 teams were entered into the Tottenham Hotspur Football tournament with outstanding performances by both teams who qualified out of the group stages only to meet each other in the semi-finals!

The Year 10 team won 3-1 and progressed to the final against St.John's who they had already beaten in the group stages. In a fiercely fought final Bishop's came second best but still qualified to represent in the regional round in 2024. Well done to all of the players who were highly commended by the Spurs coaching staff.

We are thrilled to share a remarkable experience that unfolded recently, where second-year medical students from King's College generously dedicated their time to impart valuable insights to our Year 10 students.




SEN Y11 Sponsored read for UNICEF – GAZA Humanitarian Appeal



Hundreds and thousands of children are affected by the conflict in Gaza and Israel.

Y11 SEN pupils watched reports on the news and wanted to help the humanitarian effort to support children in Gaza. It has been reported on the BBC News that there are 1.5 million displaced people with limited access to basic needs such as water, food, electricity and health services.

UNICEF Gaza Emergency Appeal need money to provide resources for the children in Gaza.

- £32 could help provide blankets for 5 children.
- £39 could provide a family with an emergency water and hygiene kit.
- £68 could help pay for school supplies to help at least 20 children continue their education in an emergency.

On the 7th December 2023, the SENCo, Teaching Assistant and pupils read a book of their choice throughout lunch time.

All the pupils were sponsored by friends, family and colleagues to read for Gaza.

We raised £105!

We are very proud of our Y11 pupils and the cheque will be sent to UNICEF to help the children of Gaza.


Sixth Form News
