Dear parents/carers,

I hope this end of term letter finds you well. I wanted to share some exciting news with you regarding Bishop Stopford's School. Following our recent Ofsted inspection in January, I am delighted to announce that our school continues to be rated as 'good'. This is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our staff, students, and the entire school community; no doubt you will have already received our press release that has been circulated publicly. The report commended our school for its high expectations, welcoming and supportive approach, and ambitious curriculum. It highlighted that Bishop Stopford's School has created a nurturing and harmonious community based on equality. We firmly believe that everyone can achieve beyond their expectations, and our motto of 'believe, strive, succeed' is at the heart of everything we do.

Inspectors noted that leaders at our school make sure that students are happy and safe, and they show determination that students can flourish. This ambition extends to students with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). The report also emphasised that our school champions diversity, with pupil and staff diversity ambassadors organising a range of events throughout the year. We are proud that our students are positive role models for younger students and provide support for their peers

Furthermore, the report highlighted several other areas of success, including the provision of a broad and balanced curriculum, effective support for students' knowledge and skills, and the prioritisation of reading and literacy development. They noted that we ensure that our students are well-prepared for life beyond school, and provide a wide range of activities, clubs, and leadership opportunities. Opportunities for our students has been bolstered by our representation on two new charity trusts focused on providing opportunities and links to industry

In addition to the Ofsted report, I am also pleased to share that our recent SIAMS inspection (attached to this letter, and found on the school's website) in March, 2024, has been equally positive. The report stated that:

The school's vision is absolutely central to all its work; the quality of relationships in the school is excellent. Staff and students are courteous and kind to each other and support each other with care. Students are confident and articulate.



They are proud of their school and willingly accept opportunities to lead and to influence school practices. Collective worship is carefully planned and imaginatively supports the school's vision and values. It is rightly seen as important by all members of the school community. Students and adults who wish to practice their faith are given encouragement and ample opportunities to do so. A Christian group meets weekly and a room is set aside for prayer, which is used extensively by Muslim staff and students. Once more this is testament to our harmonious community; grounded in equality for all.

Easter Eucharist

During our Easter Eucharist, we experienced profound joy. The worship group lifted our spirits with heartfelt renditions of songs like "Holy Forever" by Chris Tomlin, "Once Again" by Matt Redman, and "Ancient of Days" by Ron Kenoly. In the midst of God's presence, we were moved by a sermon on forgiveness delivered by Andie Frost. His exploration of forgiveness prompted deep reflection, reminding us of the significance of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross for our redemption.

The sermon was based on Matthew 18:21–35 which teaches several important lessons about forgiveness:

- The importance of forgiveness: The passage emphasizes that forgiveness is a fundamental aspect of Christian life. Jesus instructs Peter to forgive not just seven times, but seventy-seven times (or seventy times seven), indicating limitless forgiveness.
- God's forgiveness: The parable of the unforgiving servant illustrates God's immense grace and mercy towards us. The master represents God, who forgives the servant's enormous debt out of compassion, despite the servant's inability to repay.
- The call to extend forgiveness: Just as God forgives us, we are called to forgive others. The servant's refusal to forgive his fellow servant demonstrates a failure to grasp the depth of God's forgiveness. This highlights the expectation for Christians to extend forgiveness to those who wrong us.
- The consequences of unforgiveness: The parable warns of the severe consequences of harboring unforgiveness. The unforgiving servant is ultimately held accountable for his lack of mercy and faces harsh punishment from his master. This underscores the seriousness of holding onto grudges and refusing to forgive others.



World Book Day

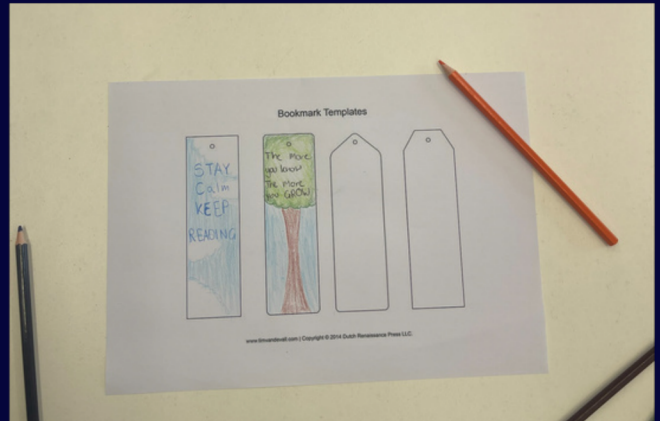
This year, in celebration of World Book Day, we engaged in a delightful activity of designing bookmarks, immersing ourselves in the joy of literature and creativity.

At Bishop's, we value learning about different traditions and customs, enriching our students' educational experience and promoting understanding and respect for all cultures.



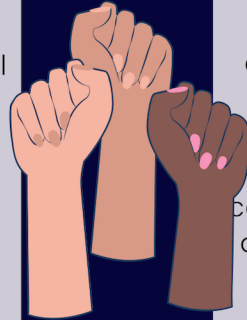
International Women's Day

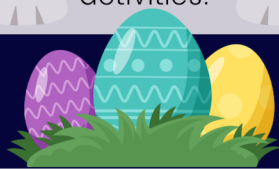

Year 12 students attended a visit to Oxford University (St Peters College) and learnt more about the application process. We had a fabulous time meeting current students and having a tour of the college.



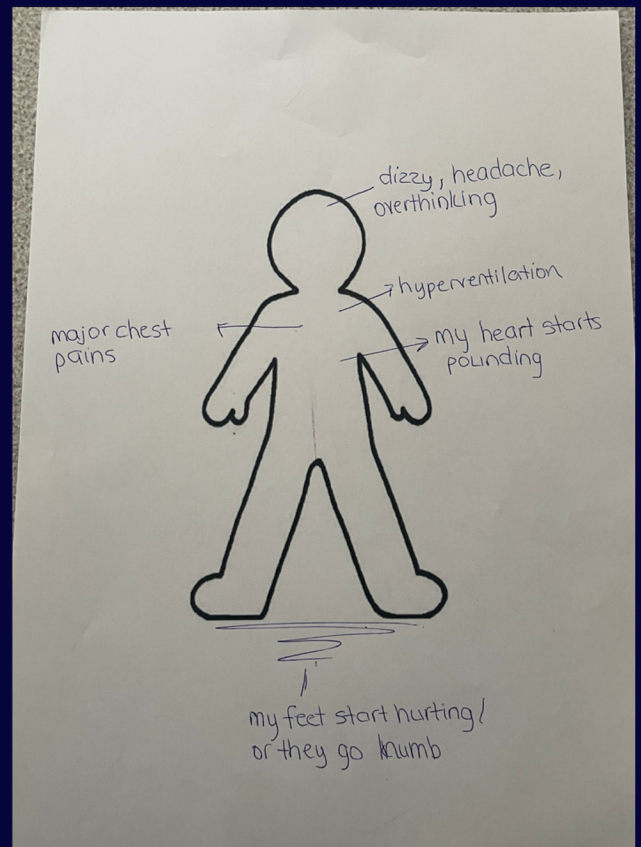
Sixth Form students have participated in a finance workshop and learnt about how they can ensure they have a positive credit rating and the advantages and challenges of credit cards.

2) Try to eat a healthy diet

Some people don't feel like eating when they're depressed and are at risk of becoming underweight. Others find comfort in food and can put on excess weight.

3) Have a routine

When people feel down, they can get into poor sleep patterns, staying up late and sleeping during the day. Try to get up at your normal time and stick to your routine as much as possible. Not having a routine can affect your eating. Try to carry on cooking and eating regular meals.

4) Face your fears

Don't avoid the things you find difficult. When people feel low or anxious, they sometimes avoid talking to other people. Some people can lose their confidence about going out, driving or travelling.
